RI PRESIDENT HOLGER KNAACK May 2021 - Message

For years, Susanne and I hosted many Rotary Youth Exchange students in our home. This program was an entry point to Rotary for me, and my heart is truly in it. When Rotary's exchange programs were suspended because of COVID-19 to keep students and families safe, we felt sorry, especially for the participants, because those years cannot be repeated.

Because of the many uncertainties of the pandemic, the Rotary Board has decided to suspend in-person exchanges through June 2022. As we look ahead with hope, we thank Youth Exchange officers, host families, and volunteers for their contributions in years past, and we encourage districts to offer virtual exchanges as a way of connecting students around the world with each other and with our communities.

For those who are not able to participate in Rotary Youth Exchange, Rotary offers other opportunities. New Generations Service Exchange (NGSE) is a Rotary program that deserves wider recognition: It is an excellent opportunity for young people ages 18 to 30 to participate in community service as individuals or in a group and to gain internship experience. Simukai Matshalaga, a Rotaractor from Zimbabwe, stayed with us in Ratzeburg during her NGSE experience three years ago.

When I applied for the New Generations Service Exchange program, I did not realize that I was signing up for a life-changing experience. This program gave me that opportunity and much more. It taught me about the importance of failing fast, learning quicker, and being myself.

Some of my greatest experiences happened at the dinner table. The warmth and kindness of every home I lived in still resonate with me today. It took me weeks to understand how a stranger could care for me as deeply as these members of the Rotary

family did. I am inspired by the lessons of humility I learned from all the amazing people I met. I came to understand a new culture and realized that the only things that separate us as people are our experiences and, at times, our false assumptions.

Professionally, it gave me confidence in my own abilities as an engineer. Seeing how other organizations handled problems made me aware that the best person to solve the challenges in my country was me. Returning home from northern Germany, I declined a promotion, quit my job, and began building a family business — a decision that previously I would have never made, out of fear.

I am indebted to the Rotary family. I am not sure whether the friends, mentors, and families I left behind knew that they changed my life permanently. I hope they now do.

New Generations Service Exchange changed Simukai's life. It can change yours, too. All Rotary members can experience something similar at any time: I encourage everyone to take a virtual journey this month and visit meetings of other clubs online. You will see how different Rotary is around the world as you meet great people and make new friends.

Let us build upon these connections forged online — and later, when the time is right, enjoy in-person exchanges through Rotary Friendship Exchange, another excellent program for Rotary members of all ages.

Our ability to meet in person is limited now, but we know that Rotary Opens Opportunities, always. Now is the time to get ready, so that when the pandemic is behind us, Rotary's exchange programs will come back stronger than before, serving a world that is yearning to reconnect.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR MESSAGE

DG MAZEN ALUMRAN 2020-2021

Fellow Rotarians,

The month of April has been assigned by Rotary International to be that for dealing with Maternity and Child Health Issues.

There is no argument on how important mothers are in the upbringing and health of children and families.

Rotary International has given a lot of attention and support to Maternity and Child Care as Robert Zinger cofounder of the Rotarian Action Group for Population and Development said, "If mothers are empowered and healthy, so are their families, leading to an alleviation





of hunger and poverty."

Most countries whether governments in their official health care capacities or Welfare charitable organizations realize the importance of Mother and Child health in communities. Sometimes this is not enough.

How does Rotary make help happen?

'The Rotary Foundation reaches mothers and children in need by giving communities the help and training they need to take control of their maternal and infant health care.'

Across different countries and communities, Rotary provided education, immunization, mobile health clinics and birth kits as required. Women were taught the importance of breastfeeding to ensure infant immunity and how to go about it, and how to protect themselves and their children from disease. In countries of high prevalence of HIV, they were taught how to prevent mother-to-infant HIV transmission.

Objectives

- To detect high risk cases & give them special care
- To identify complications and prevent them
- · To educate the mother
- To promote, protect and maintain health

Some statistics point out to the fact that 5.9 million children under the age of five die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care and poor sanitation. This can be prevented if quality care to mothers and children can be made more accessible.


Objectives of Mother, Child Health Care

- Reduce maternal mortality and morbidity.
- Reduce per natal and neonatal mortality and morbidity.
- Regulate fertility so as to have wanted and healthy children when desired.
- Provide basic maternal and child health care
 to all mother and children.
- Promote and protect health of mothers.
- Promote and protect physical growth and psycho-social development of children.

In some less developed countries, help was provided in the shape of hospital equipment like incubators for premature infants, while in remote or rural areas sustainable access was made possible to skilled health personnel, sometimes through telemedicine: technology to access information from skilled nurses and doctors. Promoting breast-feeding, immunizations and regular checkups were encouraged. Also, by distributing clean childbirth kits, Rotary members helped provide training for health workers in safe deliveries of babies and keeping children alive during their first year.



As early as the late fifties, early sixties, in Bahrain, my mother, together with a number of Society Ladies, started a Society called Children and Mothers' Welfare Society. Its objective was to empower women to take control of their lives, their health and that of their children and families. They provided information and training to help communities, especially in villages. When the need arose for immunization from diseases, they were the first out to convince families of its necessity. This was before Rotary Clubs started in Bahrain. Now, of course, Bahrain has adequate Public Health Centers all over the country that deal with this. However, this shows the importance of Maternity and Children's health in the development of any country.



Rotary today, continues to play a vital role in uncovering Maternal and Children Health requirements in the communities that need attention and directing their projects towards them. This might not be local, but within the District or other areas of the World. In these days of the Covid-19 pandemic, clubs in our District should direct their attention to educating communities, including Mothers of the dangers of Covid, how to protect themselves against it, what to do if they were pregnant and how to protect infants. They should also stress the importance of vaccinations, especially for the elderly in the family.



DID YOU KNOW? MEMBERSHIP IN ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

Tf you asked a Rotarian if he or she belonged to Rotary International, the individual probably would look puzzled and answer, "Of course I'm a member of Rotary International." But in this instance, the confident Rotarian would be technically wrong. No Rotarian can be a member of Rotary International! The explanation of this apparent contradiction is simple. The constitutional documents of R.I. state that membership in Rotary International is limited to Rotary clubs. Over 30,000 Rotary clubs belong to the organization we call Rotary International. A Rotary club is composed of persons with the appropriate qualifications of good character and reputation, a business or professional classification and who serve in an executive or managerial capacity. The Rotarian belongs to a club- the club belongs to Rotary International. This technical distinction is not obvious or even known to most Rotarians and seldom does it create any problems or complications. It does explain, however, why the Rotary International Board of Directors places expectations upon and extends privileges to Rotary clubs, rather than to individual Rotarians. If someone asks if you belong to Rotary International, your most accurate answer would be, "No, I belong to a Rotary club." But I doubt if anyone would understand the difference, or, in fact, would really care.

✦ Smaller projects were discussed, like preparing a gift of books for the Public Library which will distribute them to the regions. Stickers are ready with inscription "From Rotary Club of Tbilisi Academia" and a Rotarian wheel on it.

✦ Club members participated in various club meetings in the District (like Salmaniya club, Bahrain)

Congratulations District 2452 for contributing to the success of this event! 12 clubs out of 58 have participated to the Zone 21B video competition.





Thank you for awarding our club and we look forward to sustain the same momentum of service above self in the years to come.





If for lay people Valentine's consists in offering red roses or a box of chocolate , this February 14, Rotarians from 28 RC in Lebanon showed their love of Service Above Self by offering redical material from 2x40' containers received from France RC Tours Plumereau D1720 and RC Paray Le Monial et Charolais D1750 to Hospitals, dispensaries and needy people.

بعد وقوع انفجار مرفأ بيروت الكارثي، تداعت أندية الروتاري في لبنان مُشْكِلة خلية عمل لا تهدأ.

وباشرت كل منها في الاتصال بالجهات المانحة لتأمين ما يلزم من مساعدات، سواء أكان للعائلات المحتاجة والمتضررة جراء الانفجار، أو للمدارس والمستشفيات.

ومن هذه الميادرات ما قام به نادي بيروت متروبوليتان، الذي تواصل مع رئيس نادي PLUMERAU FRANCE السيد روبير الشدياق الذي بدوره قام بالاتصال بالاندية والجهات المائحة ما نتج عنه تأمين عشرة أطنان من المعدات الطبية.

أصر نادي متروبوليتان على ان هذه الهية ستكون هبة لجميع الاندية الروتارية في لينان متحدةً، والبالغ عددها 28 نادياً، وان العمل كمجموعة سيكتب له حتما النجاح.هذا فضلاً عن شموليته ليطال ليس فقط العاصمة بيروت بل كل أرجاء الوطن.

وقد تم توزيع هذه المعدات واللوازم الطبية على مراحل كان أخرها يوم السبت الواقع فيه 13 شباط 2021.

واستقدامن مذا العمل الجبّار كل من المستفيات التالية، الروم، الجعيّاري، المركز الطبي للجامعة اللبنانية الأميركية (رزق)، بيروت الحكومي (الكرنتينا)، جمعية ARC EN CIEL ، دار المسنين المنصورية ، جمعية St Vincent de PAUL ، الدفاع المدني ، السجون، كلية بكنتين ، وغير ها من المؤسسات والجمعيات والمنظمات غير الحكومية ودور العجزة ومؤسسات رعاية الاطفال ومستشفيات آخرى في المناطق.

After the disastrous explosion of the Port of Beirut, the Rotary Clubs in 8 Lebanon came together to form a restless work cell. Each of them began to contact donors to secure the necessary aid whether for families in need, or for schools and hospitals .

Among these initiatives, the Rotary Club of Beirut Metropolitan contacted the president of PLUMERAU FRANCE, Mr. Robert Chidiac, who in turn contacted the clubs and donors in France, resulting in the provision of ten tons of medical equipment .

The Rotary Club of Beirut Metropolitan insisted that this donation/fundraising should be extended to all the 28 Rotary clubs currently present in Lebanon. Working as a group would inevitably be successful in order to reach not only the capital Beirut, but also all parts of the country .

The medical equipment and supplies were distributed in stages, the last one being on Saturday, February 13, 2021 .

The hospitals that benefited from this tremendous work: Roum, Jeitaoui, Lebanese American University Medical Center (Rizk), Beirut Governmental Hospital (Karantina), ARC EN CIEL Association, Mansouriya Elderly Home, St Vincent de PAUL Association, Civil Defense, Prisons Bikften College, and other institutions, associations, non-governmental organizations, nursing homes, childcare institutions and district hospitals.

The value of the donation amounted to 100,000 euros, collected from French clubs, doctors and Lebanese expatriates .

This initiative would not have taken place without District 1720 - Rotary Club Tours Plumereau RC Paray Le Monial et Charolais; and District 1750 Bourgogne et Champagne

A special thanks also goes to CMA CGM Travel, which provided shipping services from Marseille to Beirut, and everyone who contributed from near or far to the success of this project and its implementation .

Yes, it is the Rotary. Yes, it is the tender that has no limits and does not distinguish between one person and another or one region and another. Rotary will remain the leading institution in free volunteer work with its motto: Service Above Self.
